# Prestigious Built Green<sup>TM</sup> Awards Presented to Outstanding Companies and Individuals in the Building Industry

(Everett, Wash.) – Built Green<sup>TM</sup>, an environmental building program of the Master Builders Association of King and Snohomish Counties, presents the winners of the second annual Hammer and Pioneer Awards with their distinguished honors today. These awards are designed to recognize the people and companies who have been instrumental in the success of the Built Green<sup>TM</sup> program.

The presentation of the annual awards is taking place at 11:30 a.m. today at the Built Green<sup>TM</sup> Conference at the Everett Events Center in Everett. The awards are sponsored by Triad Associates.

The Built Green<sup>TM</sup> Hammer Awards are awarded to companies for their outstanding green building projects and program advocacy in 2006. There are 10 categories under this award and one winner for each category. Award recipients are judged on several criteria based on records from the 2006 year, including number of homes that are Built Green<sup>TM</sup> certified, the star level to which the homes were certified (based on a 4-star rating system), innovative sustainable building design and construction, and what actions the company has taken to move the green building industry and Built Green<sup>TM</sup> program forward.

The Built Green<sup>TM</sup> Pioneer Awards are awarded to seven individuals or companies who have made significant contributions to the Built Green<sup>TM</sup> program since the program's inception in 2001.
